

Gut feelings saved my life

A VICTORIAN man believes a Brazilian spiritual healer saved his life with what the healer calls X-ray vision.

Max Moore, 60, of Clunes, said he thought he had pulled a stomach muscle when he experienced an abdominal twinge.

But it turned out to be a potentially dangerous condition, known as infarcted omentum, which can lead to peritonitis if left untreated.

“I believe she saved my life,” Mr Moore said.

“If she hadn’t convinced me to go to hospital I definitely would have hopped in my car, driven home and put up with it until it was too late.”

Mr Moore was doing some freelance building work in Collins St organ-

ised by spiritual healer Antonia Ruhl. He was feeling off colour but said he was not in great pain and was working when he saw Ms Ruhl.

“She helped me put some left over wood from a partition into my ute and said we had to go to hospital straight away,” Mr

Moore said. “She described exactly what I was feeling — over-heated and nauseous — but I really didn’t want to go to hospital and kept telling her but she insisted.

“By the time I got to hospital I was in extreme pain.”

Tests were inconclusive.

Exploratory surgery was performed and infarcted omentum was diagnosed.

Ms Ruhl said she knew she had X-ray vision when she was six and told her mother she was pregnant with a boy. Her mother was outraged, not even knowing she was pregnant. Her son was born seven months later.

“I see what I see but with a gift comes certain responsibilities,” she said. “If I see something serious inside someone such as a tumour I advise them to see a medical doctor.”

Ms Ruhl said she could see internal organs and bones and from a distance saw people as colour and water.

Ms Ruhl will display and teach her gifts, including X-ray vision, at a special event *Soul Retrieval — The Secret Transition to the Fourth Dimension*, on November 27.
